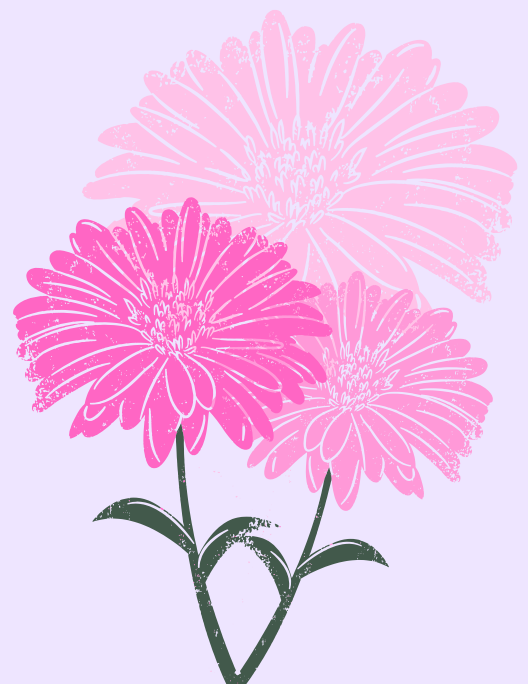

RIDE2SCHOOL DAY - FRIDAY 20 MARCH

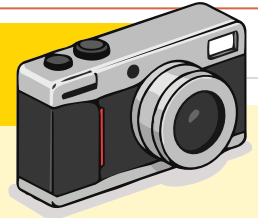
National Ride2School day is Friday 20 March. Those students that ride a bike to school on Friday 20 March will receive a special bike riding sticker for their efforts.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY

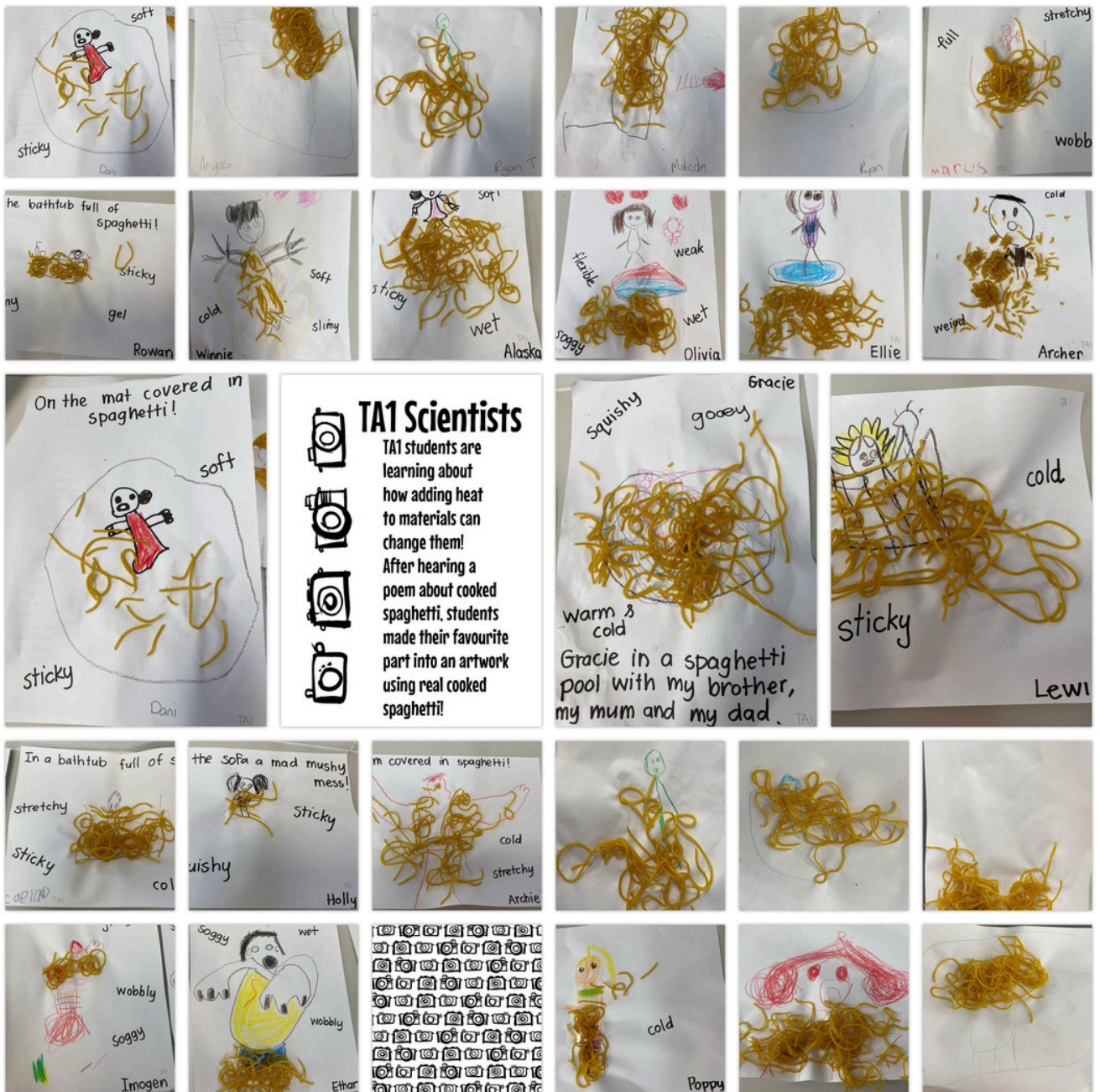


This year School photo day will be held on **Monday 30 March**.

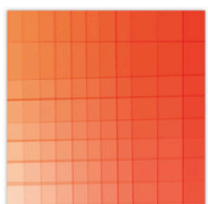
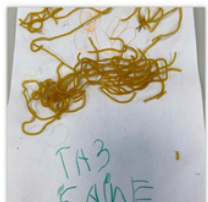
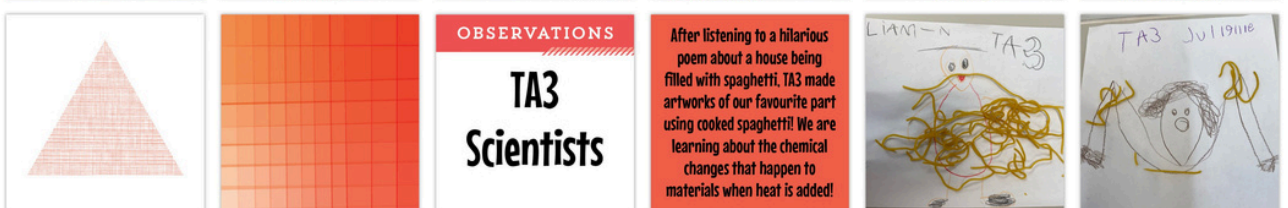
The whole school from Kindergarten to Year 6 will be photographed on the one day, including sibling photos.

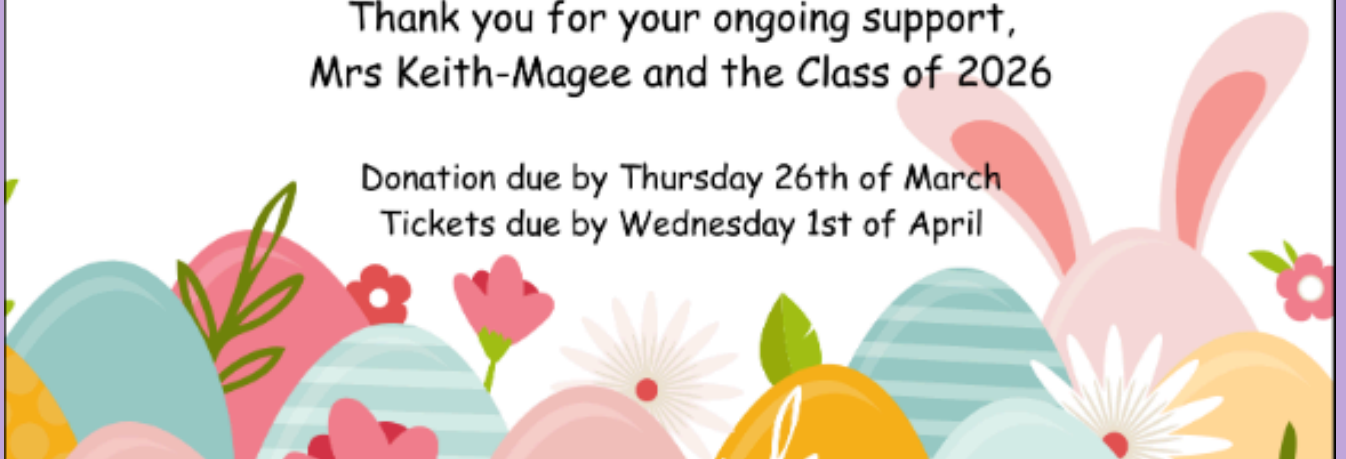
There will be at least two prizes per class. All children will assemble in the undercover area at 2:15pm on the last day of term (Thursday 2nd April) for the drawing of the prizes.
