SCHOOL PROCESSES

Reporting student achievement and progress to Parents:

Our school continues to prioritise strong partnerships with families through clear and meaningful reporting. In 2026, we will maintain our current reporting processes, with no changes to how parent meetings are conducted. Our parent meetings/reporting will be in Term 2 on **Tuesday 2 June**.

More information about time slots for phone or face-to-face meetings will be provided early next term. Not making any changes this year aligns with Department guidance and the School Board's consensus decision.

Looking ahead, a new reporting approach will be introduced in 2027. As part of this change, the school will close for one day in Term 2 to support parent interviews and reporting.

The updated policy allows schools to use the day for reporting to parents, providing quality feedback about their child and strengthen home-school connections.

Further details about the 2027 changes will be shared with families closer to implementation.

ALLERGY AWARE

Hawker Park Primary School is an allergy-aware school.

While we encourage families to avoid sending foods containing nuts, we recognise that we cannot completely eliminate all allergens from our environment. Instead, we focus on education, awareness, and shared responsibility to help keep all students safe.

We encourage all students to:

- Wash their hands before and after eating
- **NOT** share food with others
- Avoid bringing food items that contain nuts

Our staff:

- Supervise students during eating times
- Encourage and support handwashing after eating
- Are trained in first aid and anaphylaxis management
- Have access to general use EpiPens if required
- Deliver age-appropriate education about allergies and safety

We appreciate the ongoing support of our school community in helping us create a safe and inclusive environment for every child.

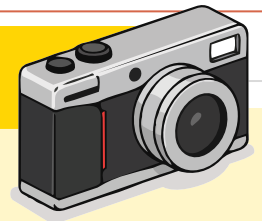

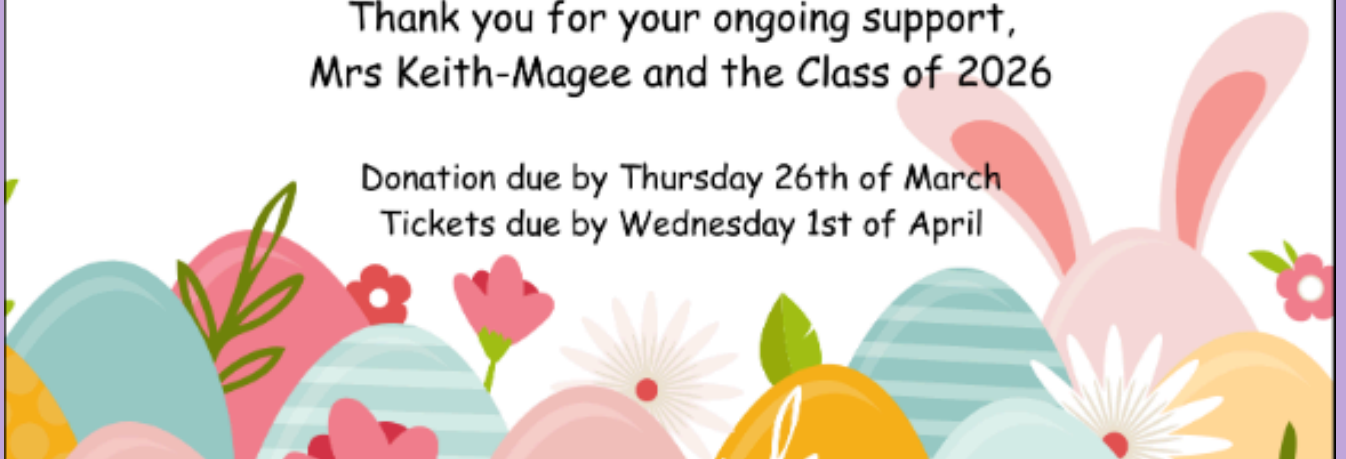
There will be at least two prizes per class. All children will assemble in the undercover area at 2:15pm on the last day of term (Thursday 2nd April) for the drawing of the prizes.
