Please note we will not have paper consent forms for any excursions.

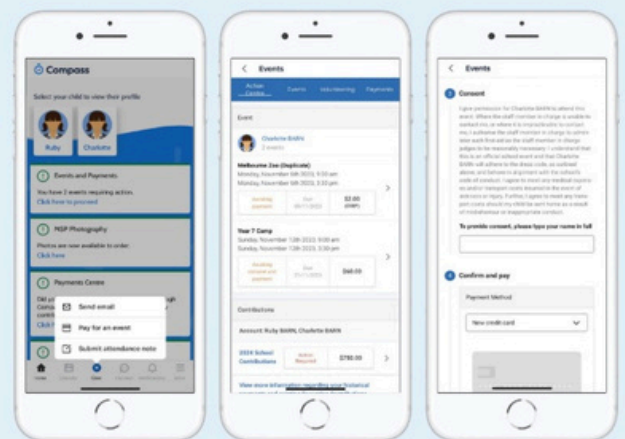
Instructions on how to use the Compass excursion feature can be found below.

Enrolment Requirements

When enrolling your child, you will be asked to provide:

- Student's Birth Certificate or Passport
- If your child is an Australian citizen but both parents were born overseas, then proof of one of the parent's permanent residency/citizenship
- Australian Immunisation History (AIR) Statement (dated within 2 months).
- Visa documents (if applicable)
- Kindergarten & Pre-primary history form

Proof of Address Documents can include:

- A Lease Agreement, Proof of ownership of a property such as Land / Water Rates Notice, Driver's License or a recent gas or electrical account

Additional Needs / Medical Diagnosis:

- Parents/carers of students with additional needs are asked to contact the school, to discuss their child's requirements.

Building Strong Number Fact Fluency at Home

At Hawker Park Primary School, we are working to develop confident and capable mathematicians. One of the most important ways parents can help is by supporting the development of number fact fluency at home.

Number fact fluency means being able to recall basic facts quickly and accurately without needing to count on fingers or use a calculator. When these facts become automatic, children can focus their attention on solving more complex mathematical problems.

Just 10–15 minutes of daily practice can make a significant difference.

What Facts Should Children Know?

The Western Australian Curriculum builds fluency progressively across the primary years.

Pre-Primary

Children should be developing confidence with:

- Counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Recognising numbers instantly to 10
- Comparing quantities
- Simple addition and subtraction using materials and pictures
- Understanding "one more" and "one less"

Year 1

Children should become fluent with:

- Addition facts to 10
- Subtraction facts to 10
- Doubles facts (e.g. $4 + 4 = 8$)
- Counting forwards and backwards from any number to 100
- Skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s

Year 2

Children should become fluent with:

- Addition and subtraction facts to 20
- Related fact families (e.g. $7 + 5 = 12$, $12 - 7 = 5$)
- Near doubles (e.g. $6 + 7$)
- Skip counting by 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s
- Place value to 1000

Year 3

Children should know:

- Addition and subtraction facts automatically
- Multiplication facts for 2, 3, 5 and 10
- Related division facts
- Number patterns and relationships

Year 4 and Beyond

Children should be fluent with:

- All multiplication facts to 10×10
- Related division facts
- Efficient mental and written calculation strategies

Why Basic Facts Matter

Children who know their addition and subtraction facts automatically are more successful when learning:

- Multiplication and division
- Fractions and decimals
- Problem-solving
- Measurement
- Algebra

Strong foundations make future learning easier.

Easy Ways to Practise at Home

You don't need worksheets or expensive resources.

Try:

- Dice games
 - Card games
 - Quick-fire number fact challenges
 - Practising doubles and halves
 - Skip counting in the car
 - Counting collections at home
 - Discussing numbers while shopping or cooking
- The goal is to make mathematics part of everyday life.

Working Together

When schools and families work together, children develop the confidence, fluency and resilience needed for mathematical success.

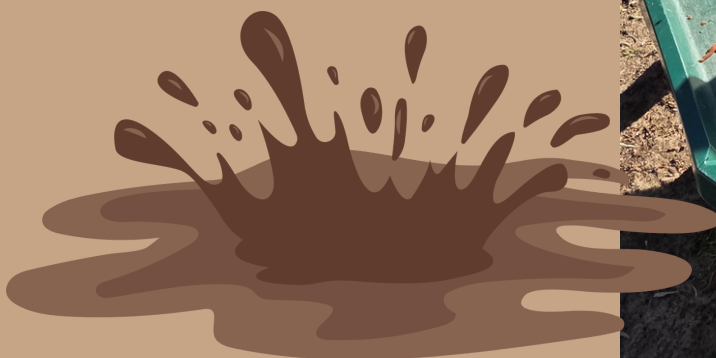
Remember: five minutes of number facts every day is more powerful than one hour once a week.

Influenza vaccination reminder

Dear families,

Influenza (flu) is a highly contagious virus that can cause significant illness in children, even those who are usually healthy. Symptoms usually start suddenly and may include fever, chills, headache, a dry cough, sore throat, and tiredness or weakness.

As influenza season approaches, families are encouraged to consider influenza vaccination for their child, where appropriate. The best time to be vaccinated is usually April or May, before influenza season begins.

By helping protect your child, you are also helping protect the health and wellbeing of our wider school community. If you have any questions about influenza vaccination, please speak with your GP or healthcare provider.
