## SCHOOL PROCESSES

### Administering daily medication at School

Due to limited staff, the large and increasing number of students requiring medication during school hours, and to ensure children do not miss their medication dose, we will be streamlining our process to help minimise disruption to learning time.

*Daily medication will be administered at 12:30pm each day starting Monday 4 May.*

Where appropriate, families may wish to speak with their child's healthcare provider about whether a long-acting medication taken at home would be a suitable option.

We have contacted parents with students taking daily medication to adjust times at home to align with this schedule, where possible.

  - Passport or travel documents
  - Current visa subclass and previous visa subclass  
(if applicable)

# Kindergarten 2027 applications

**Applications for Kindy 2027 opened Monday 20 April 2026 and close on Friday 24 July 2026.**

In Western Australia, children who turn 4 years old by 30 June 2027 are eligible to begin their education in Kindergarten of that year, however, compulsory schooling begins the following year in Pre-primary.

Kindergarten is a non-compulsory school year and therefore enrolment is not guaranteed regardless of the student's address, however, children who reside within our intake area are given priority when Kindergarten applications are reviewed. Out of Area applications will be considered and accommodated where possible.

Enrolment in our Kindergarten does not automatically entitle children to enrolment in the primary school. All families are required to re-apply to enrol for pre-primary.

Applications should be made during the application period. Applications received after this date will be treated as late and considered on a case-by-case basis. Please provide all supporting documentation along with your application as incomplete applications will not be considered.

## **Enrolment Procedure**

Please submit the application form along with the supporting documents to Admin between 8.00am-3:30pm Monday to Friday (during school terms).

## **Kindergarten Application Form**

### **Enrolment Requirements**

When enrolling your child, you will be asked to provide:

- Student's Birth Certificate or Passport
- If your child is an Australian citizen but both parents were born overseas, then proof of one of the parent's permanent residency/citizenship or the student's Australian Passport is also required at the time of application.
- Australian Immunisation History (AIR) Statement (dated within 2 months). A child's immunisation is expected to be up-to-date upon entry to school.

### **Proof of Address Documents can include:**

- A Lease Agreement
- Proof of ownership of a property such as Land / Water Rates Notice or
- In circumstances where there is no rental agreement, a Statutory Declaration and Driver's License of the parent is required.
- A recent gas or electrical account

### **Additional Needs / Medical Diagnosis:**

- Parents/carers of students with additional needs are asked to contact the school, at the time of enrolment, to discuss their child's requirements. This will ensure that the most appropriate program is put in place to meet the needs of their child. Please submit any supporting paperwork along with your application.

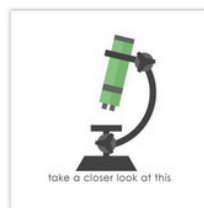

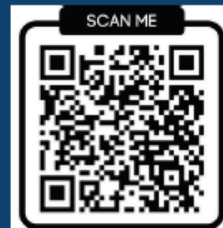
